LET'S TALK ABOUT CHRISTMAS - IN LENT

This past Christmas Eve, a special visitor traveled to Cairo, Egypt, to meet with children at an afterschool program at St. Mary Virgin Catholic Church. Father Andrew Small, OMI, National Director of the Missionary Childhood Association, came to bring children in this part of the Missions your greetings and your love – a special gift any time of the year!

Father Andrew joined the children for their annual Christmas party. There was face painting – and Santa even stopped by for a visit, bringing gifts for the children. Father Andrew also brought presents for the children – "crazy bands" bracelets in the shape of famous New York places, like the Empire State Building and the Statue of Liberty. But those were just the gifts given to children on Christmas Eve. Last year, just after Easter, your help through MCA – \$5,000 in fact – was sent to this parish to provide food for children in this afterschool program. Contributions from children in the United States to MCA last year helped close to 1,000 children just in this Alexandria area of Egypt – ensuring each received nutritious food and an education!

More help is needed, however. That was the message Father Andrew heard from local priests and Sisters here. Requests for assistance from families are increasing, as are costs for food. Please continue to pray for the children of Egypt and children all over the world. And please consider making a sacrifice this Lent to MCA to help your brothers and sisters in Egypt and throughout the Missions learn about Jesus.

Typical homes in the slum known as Makoko in Lagos, Nigeria This Lent, don't just give up your favorite food or beverage. Instead, make the sacrifice more meaningful by learning about the diets of young people in mission countries. For example, according to the United Nations World Food Program, 870 million people do not have enough to eat, and 98 percent of them live in developing countries. In addition, one out of every four of those children – about 146 million children in total – is underweight.

This Lent, consider adding 25 cents to your coin holder each time you feel hungry. Add a dollar to your coin holder every time you have a craving for a fast food – you know a "dollar menu item." In Lagos, Nigeria, just one dollar would buy two loaves of bread for a hungry family! Now might also be a good time to remind your family to offer a prayer of thanksgiving before each meal for God's generosity and to remember all who do not have enough food to eat or who have not yet heard the "Good News" of Jesus.

PENTECOST WORD SEARCH



AT A GLANCE Issues Facing Children in Bangladesh

- About 13 percent of children are involved in child labor – denied education and vulnerable to abuse.
- Only about half of the children in Bangladesh go on to high school.
- Many children are malnourished.
 Roughly half of all children under age five are underweight.
- Children face annual floods and other natural disasters, including cyclones and tornados. Bangladesh is also susceptible to earthquakes

SENDING YOUR LOVE TO BANGLADESH!

At the St. Anthony Mission Center in Shimulia, Bangladesh, some 45 children receive an education, as well as food, clothing and shelter. The mission center was started by a local priest, Father Dominic Rozario. The village where the center is located has only seven Catholic families – all of whom came to embrace our faith in Jesus through Father Rozario's own work and witness. Over several decades, his outreach to migrant workers and the most vulnerable peoples in remote areas of Bangladesh led to his opening at least five similar mission centers around the capital city of Bangladesh, Dhaka.

Three religious Sisters care for the children at the mission center. Until last year, there was no electricity – and the children had to sleep on the floor; they endured sweltering heat in the summer and cold winters. Maximum summer temperatures in Bangladesh range between 86°F and 104°F. April is the warmest month in most parts of the country. January is the coldest, with an average temperature of 50°F. Thanks to your help through MCA, the Sisters were able to buy beds for the children – and to provide for their basic needs.

BANGLADESH AND CLIMATE CHANGE

Bangladesh tops the 2012 Global Climate Risk Index, a ranking of 170 countries most vulnerable to climate change, according to Germanwatch, an international non-governmental organization (NGO) that works on environment and development issues. Bangladesh is particularly at risk because of its geography and vast flood plain. MISSION SNAPSHOT

"We thank MCA for helping us provide a home for children where they can learn and grow to become good citizens and faithful children of God," wrote Sister Mariangela Costa in a letter to the Missionary Childhood Association. Sister Mariangela helps to run a boarding school for children in Meherpur, Bangladesh. "We provide a home to very poor girls," she explained. "We offer food, clothing, education and medical care because their parents cannot afford to do so. The financial help that you give helps us to stretch our helping hands toward the poorest and most needy children."

Each year, the children at this boarding school attend a special MCA Mass with other children in a nearby parish. During that Mass, they offer their prayers and gifts for children of the world.
